- · So what is positive psychology?
- Uses science to study things like:
 - Positive emotions, psychological growth, human strengths
 - What makes life worth living!
- How do we tell how well a country is doing these days?
 - Gross domestic product (GDP) how much money is a country generating!
 - Countries can be evil.
 - 1968 Bobby Kennedy "GDP does not really work, does not include the other aspects of our world, does not measure wit, compassion, integrity etc"
 - GNH: every human being aspires for happiness, and countries should measure the happiness of its people (gross national happiness)
 - Influenced by Butan
 - Strive for development with values
 - UK assessing happiness, but not USA
 - Americans are in a very smiley place but are not doing that well.
 - Number 15 on 20 happiest countries
 - Why is USA unhappy?
 - No healthcare support (health and happiness strongly correlated)
 - We do not use our vacation time.
- PP: The study of what is right about people; what makes life worthwhile
 - Psychology has a focus on clinical aspects that are very negative.
 - PP is something is not focused on that much, what people really care about, how to become happy, can we change that person?
- PP is not Happiology
 - Unhealthy to be happy 24/7

Lecture 2: The Origins of Positive Psychology

- Ancient History of Happiness Interest
 - People who speak about positive psychology believe it was invented in the 2000s.
 - Actually has been here since Buddha, thousands of years
 - Mediation, middle path, peace, compassion for all, focus on happiness.
 - Socrates Confucius Frankl Epicurus
 - Has been studied in very different ways, not in a field of psychology yet.
 - Happiness depends on ourselves, essential as a central purpose of human life and goal itself (Aristotle)
 - Eudaimonia, as opposed to hedonics.
 - A term that comes from philosophy
 - Passing positive emotions versus dispositional life meaning stuff
 - Do you have life meaning and purpose? (Eudaimonia)
 - How are you feeling right now? Are you happy or calm (Hedonism)
 - Confusing because happiness will be used in different ways in this course
